

Important Info for athletes who want to compete in college

Any athlete planning to compete or accept an athletic scholarship needs to be registered with the NCAA Clearinghouse at HYPERLINK "http://www.ncaaclearinghouse.net" www.ncaaclearinghouse.net. It costs \$ 60.- . The NCAA verifies that the student fulfills the academic requirements of Division I or Division II. Certain 16 (14) classes are required. GPA and ACT or SAT test scores are taken into consideration.

Students should register at the start of their junior year.

YOU CANNOT SIGN A LETTER OF INTEND, COMPETE, PRACTICE, OR RECEIVE THE SCHOLARSHIP WITHOUT REGISTERING; YOU CANNOT GO ON AN OFFICIAL VISIT EITHER!!!

2. Create a profile

Go to cstv.com or rivals.com, maxpreps.com, berecruited.com or to HYPERLINK "http://www.dyestat.com" www.dyestat.com (for track) and create your profile

Many universities share those systems, and you can submit your profile to several or all universities without re-typing it.

4. Here is how you can find a college for you: Go to HYPERLINK "http://www.nvcis.intocareers.org" www.nvcis.intocareers.org. Click on *NCIS junior*. Username is *ncis*, password is *nevada*. Go to 'US schools'. Open any state, click on the college you are interested in. Click on 'Sports'. If the sport menu shows a \$ behind a particular sport it will give athletic scholarships. It also shows what division the school competes in. Go to their athletic departments and click on the coaches. Drop them an e-mail sending them your profile. Check their roster and see if they have a senior leaving who you would like to replace, or if the school would be interested in your performance. You never know. Good luck!
